An Open Letter to the Lions of Multiple District 23

Fellow Lions:

As dedicated Lions, we continually challenge ourselves to raise awareness and monies in the fight against blindness, and to help those who are vision impaired. I believe it is imperative that we actively seek out those in need of the tremendous services and energy Lions can and do provide, and it is for that reason that I am writing to you.

I would like to introduce you to the Braille Class at Brookfield High School. As you will learn from the following letter written by the students, this is believed to be the only class of its kind in a public school in Connecticut, and perhaps the United States. My home club has supported the efforts of this class for the past couple of years with our Lions time, talent and monies. However, the class needs now exceed our club's financial capabilities, and they are looking to broaden awareness of their program by trying to solicit donations from a broader base towards the purchase of equipment. The leaders of the class are investigating all avenues to fund their program, but still require a helping hand.

Due to the uniqueness of the program offered at Brookfield High School, I have a special request of the Lions of Multiple District 23. I would like you to consider some amount of financial support for the Braille Class. This may come from individual donations, or perhaps a Club, Zone or even a Region project. If you agree with me that this is truly a worthwhile endeavor for Lions in Connecticut, then please communicate directly with the class as requested in the letter, and make a contribution towards the purchase of equipment. Thanks very much for your consideration.

To whom it may concern:

We are sighted students at Brookfield High School who are involved in the only Braille class in Connecticut and possibly the United States. In addition to learning to read and write Braille, we are learning to interact with students who are visually impaired. As part of the class, we learned about mobility such as sighted guide, cooking and eating blindfolded and the different ways to cope with blindness; we have learned to have more empathy for people with disabilities and handicaps. It has also given us a new prospective on life. For example, watching blind students learn to button a shirt, or put on a belt, makes us appreciate the little things in life. That really makes us want to help those with disabilities overcome the smallest obstacles that we normally take for granted.

Our problem is that the economy in Connecticut has caused many budget cuts for schools. Since the visually impaired students are graduating soon, the equipment that we use to learn and practice Braille is leaving with them. Some of the students that are in their second year of Braille will not be able to continue on to the third level of Braille. Some of the students have chosen this as a career pathway and without a Braille class they will not be able to pursue their career.

We are asking for your consideration to assist us with purchasing the following equipment: 10 braillewriters, an embosser, and the Duxbury Braille Translator software. A braillewriter is the equivalent to an old fashion typewriter without ink. It raises the stiff paper to make the Braille cells so blind students can read what is written. The reason we need so many is because all of the students use them. Next is the embosser; this is basically a printer but it raises the words in Braille once it is translated on the Duxbury Braille Translator software. Duxbury is a program that translates documents to Braille. This is used to produce worksheets and other documents.

With all this equipment we will be able to continue the Braille class at Brookfield High School. Newtown Lions Celebrate 60 Years of Service

On November 15, 2008, The Newtown Lions Club celebrated 60 years of service to the town, state, national, and international communities. The event was held at Three Oaks at Capellaro's Grove. Present at the Gala were Newtown selectman Herb Rosenthal, the Vice District Governor of Lions District 23A, Mark Lyon, Past District 23A Governor Kris Nanavagty, Zone 5 Chairperson Bob Rascona, Brookfield Lions Club President Susan Gabriele, Danbury Lions Club President Jerry Hofmann, 11 past Newtown Lions Club presidents and present Lions Club President, Tom Evagash, who acted as MC. All were accompanied by their spouses. Ninety people enjoyed an evening of reminiscing about bygone years of service, especially to the town of Newtown.

The Lions Club of Newtown was established on October 30, 1948 and was sponsored by the Lions Club of Danbury, Connecticut. One of its founding members, William Honan, along with Gordon Williams, spoke of the many service which the Lions Club has provided over the years. Included was the George Trull Award, which honored the first Lions Club president, provided \$25.00 to an outstanding boy and girl from the Junior Class at Newtown High School. This award exists today as the Trull Award, which goes to the Leo of the Year at Newtown High. The Lions Club purchased portable bleachers for Hawley School in 1949. In 1951 Lions members repaired and repainted the "Welcome to Newtown" signs at six main entrance roads to Newtown. The first Drivers Education classes came to Newtown High School when the Lions Club underwrote the cost of gas and maintenance for a dual control car that was donated to the High School by Liberty Garage and the Lions Club of Newtown in 1954/1955. In June of 1955 a 6 night carnival was sponsored by the Lions Club to raise money for charitable donations. In 1956 the Lions donated, not only time, but the finances to provide a 16' X 32' bath house at Dickenson Park. In 1963 a refreshment stand was also donated and set up at the park. In 1969 the first Lions Club Car Raffle was initiated. A new Oldsmobile Cutlass was raffled. A total of 1,250 tickets were sold and again the money was donated to Newtown, to support Pop Warner football. In 1979 a hut was built and paid for by the Lions to provide warmth for ice skaters at Dickenson Park. The Lions also sponsored the "Miss Newtown Pageant" in that same year. A Personal Computer Fair raffle was held in 1983 – proceeds of which went to CLERF, the Connecticut Eye Research Foundation and Camp Hemlock for disabled youngsters. Town Hall Mural funds were raised by the Lions Club in 1984. In 1985, another car raffle was held. The proceeds of \$6,000 from a 1986 Pontiac Fiero raffle went to national and local projects. Light bulb sales in 1989 benefited eye research, diabetes research, Meals on Wheels, The Booth Library and the Cullen Memorial. In June of 1990 a seven day Caribbean Cruise was raffled and in November a trip for two to Disneyworld was raffled. The beneficiary of both raffles was the Town of Newtown. In 1992 the Lions Club started its annual Mustang Raffle. It has proven very successful and continues until today. A 1966 Mustang was the first to be raffled. 3,500 tickets were sold and \$16,000 went to local, national and international charities. Since 1993, a Ford Mustang convertible, between the years 1964 ½ and 1968, has been the main fundraising attraction of the Newtown Lions Club. In 1996 a Gazebo, valued at \$5,500 was donated to Nunnawauk Meadows. In 1997, the "Lose The Litter" annual clean-up day was initiated and continues to this day. Lions pledged \$4,300 to the Booth Library for the purchase of a puppet theater, puppets, and a projector in 1998. In 1999 The Lions Club took over sponsorship of "Pizza and Politics", a forum which allowed local candidates to debate and be questioned by Newtowners. In the year 2000, the Lions co-sponsored a fundraising effort to build a playground at Treadwell Park. The cost was approximately \$80,000. In 2004, a major

undertaking by the Lions Club saw the replacement of 411 theater seats at Edmund Town Hall replaced at a cost of \$300.00 per seat. Approximately \$150,000.00 was raised to complete this project. This project was completed in December of 2007. Also, in 2004, \$4,000.00 was pledged by the Lions Club to save our annual Labor Day Parade, and the Orchard Hill Nature Center was rededicated, with the Lions providing both money and labor for this project. In the fall of that same year the Lions Club began an on-going project to send care packages to service members in Iraq, Afghanistan and Kuwait. In 2005 we donated \$1000.00 to the tsunami relief fund. In 2007 we sponsored Karen King on a trip to Ghana for Unite For Sight, an agency that provides assistance a eye clinics in Buduburam.

In total, the Lions Club of Newtown will donate more than \$42,000.00 to 40 local agencies and more than \$25,000.00 to state, national, and international agencies, this year alone.

Not only do the Lions Clubs in 23A help those in need in their community, but also many of our Lions help other Lions when a need arises that often go unnoticed. I'd like to cite 2 recent examples.

The first, the North Bridgeport Lions Club held a wine tasting and raffle in order to raise funds to purchase a much needed refrigerator for The Thomas Merton Center (the center is much more than a soup kitchen to so many. It is a house of hospitality, day shelter, sanctuary, and welcoming place of hope and care to the hundreds of people it provides with food, love, and a helping hand each day.) They were successful, but the new refrigerator also needed new updated circuitry that had to be installed by an electrician. Lion Ed Haberli, a Meriden Lion and owner of Haberli Electric, generously donated his time to install the new circuit and the refrigerator in now in full use.

The second example, IPDG Rose Marie Spatafore of the Seymour Lions Club sent out a request to Lions in 23A asking for a wheelchair that was desperately needed for a woman in Seymour who could not afford one. The responses were immediate...in fact IPDG Rose received not one but three replies for a free wheelchair from the Lions in 23A.

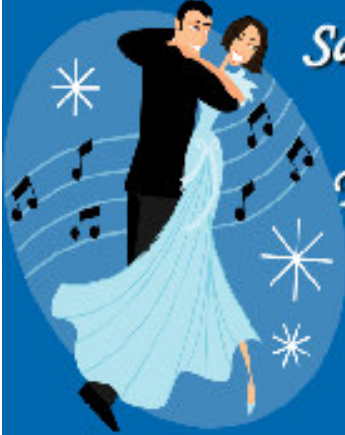
No tours can be offered during the convention. Tours must be held before the start or after the end of the convention. The bid should include all tour related transportation, lodging, transfers, etc.
